



## Summer School 2018 Information for Families



The School District of Maple is pleased to announce that Summer School courses will once again be offered during the summer. We have many exciting course options for students of all ages.

Please review the attached course descriptions and return the Registration Form along with any course fees to your child(s) teacher by **Friday, May 18, 2018**. Fees are **non-refundable** after this date.

Some important points to remember:

- Transportation is NOT provided for summer school.
- Courses are offered this year at IRES, NES, NMS, and NHS.
- Each child should bring his/her own snack/lunch daily ***as meals may not be provided (pending staffing)***.
- You will receive a phone call from your child's summer school teacher prior to the start of summer school.
- Elementary students need to be walked into the building and to the assigned classroom. Elementary parents/family members must sign the student in and out with the teacher daily.
- Enrollment in each course is limited and will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. A registration form will not be considered complete without the supply fee. Fees are non-refundable after the due date.
- All students are eligible to enroll in more than one course, depending on the schedule of the courses chosen.
- Please do not allow your child to be at school when he/she is not enrolled in a course. No additional supervision is provided.
- The School District of Maple Student Handbooks (NES, IRES, NMS and NHS) will be adhered to for any and all issues concerning student expectations. Please ask for a copy if you are not familiar with any particular areas.
