## WHO QUALIFIES?

\*Any senior citizen 62 years of age or older who receives Social Security and has taxable property within the School District of Maple

\*Limit of 15 seniors per year can participate.

## HOW IS A WORKER COMPENSATED?

The compensation, which is \$7.25 per hour, (maximum of \$400), is distributed annually in the form of a two party check made out to the worker and the appropriate town, village or county treasurer.

## APPLICATION DETAILS

A STEP application indicates the type of work and the amount of hours he/she desires. This information is matched with a staff member’s job request which must be directly related to her/his primary area of responsibility. An interview will precede actual employment.
